Types of Training

The Basic Statutory course covers the following subject matters: meetings (including formal discussion, Weingarten and bypass); duty to bargain (including de minimis and "covered by"); interference and discrimination; scope of bargaining; information requests under the Statute; timeliness; and 7116(d). In six of the regions the course is one day, in San Francisco, the course is presented over two days (duty to bargain, scope of bargaining and information requests are presented the second day).

The Advanced Statutory course is designed for those individuals who have knowledge of the principles covered in the Basic Statutory Training course. This course builds upon the knowledge gained in the first course and provides the student with an opportunity to develop a more in-depth knowledge of collective bargaining and related topics. The class format relies principally upon hypotheticals and interactive exercises.
