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The FLRA Office of the General Counsel Releases Collective Bargaining Video Training Series

Today, the Office of the General Counsel released a <u>5-part video series on Collective Bargaining in the federal government</u>, describing elements of the collective bargaining process under the Federal Service Labor-Management Relations Statute (Statute). The video series is posted as a <u>playlist</u> on <u>FLRA's YouTube channel</u>, as well as in <u>FLRA's video training library</u> at FLRA.gov.

<u>The series</u> educates federal employees, unions, and managers on what is included in the scope of bargaining, when there is a duty to bargain, what represents good and bad faith bargaining, what defenses exist affecting a party's duty to bargain, and remedies when violations occur.
