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The FLRA Issues Proposed Rule Regarding In-Person Filing.

Today, the FLRA issued <u>a proposed rule</u>, which would revise 5 C.F.R. § 2429.24(a) to specify that, if parties wish to file documents with the FLRA's Office of Case Intake and Publication in person, then they must schedule an appointment at least one business day in advance. The proposed rule also makes minor technical and formatting changes.

The FLRA welcomes comments on <u>the proposed rule</u>. Any written comments must be received on or before October 30, 2023. <u>The *Federal Register* Notice</u> includes instructions for submitting comments.

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The FLRA administers the labor-management relations program for 2.1 million non-Postal federal employees worldwide, approximately 1.2 million of whom are represented in 2,200 bargaining units. It is charged with providing leadership in establishing policies and guidance related to federal sector labor-management relations and with resolving disputes under, and ensuring compliance with, the Federal Service Labor-Management Relations Statute.
