The FLRA Releases Employee Elections Video Training Series

Charlotte A. Dye, Acting General Counsel of the Federal Labor Relations Authority (FLRA), today released a 3-part video series on Representation Elections in the federal government describing the employee organizing and election process under the Federal Service Labor-Management Relations Statute (Statute). The videos have been posted on the Agency's YouTube channel, as well as on the FLRA's video training library page.

The series educates federal employees, unions, and managers on how employees organize and file representation petitions with the FLRA, how they work with the Office of the General Counsel (OGC) to develop election agreements, and how the OGC conducts elections on behalf of the FLRA.
