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FLRA ANNOUNCES APPOINTMENT OF REGIONAL ATTORNEYS IN THE OFFICE OF THE GENERAL COUNSEL

The Office of General Counsel (OGC) of the Federal Labor Relations Authority (FLRA) is pleased to announce the appointment of Sandra LeBold as Regional Attorney of the Chicago Regional Office and Timothy Sullivan as Regional Attorney of the Denver Regional Office. In their new positions, Ms. LeBold and Mr. Sullivan will be responsible for assisting the Regional Directors in Chicago and Denver in the investigation and processing of unfair labor practice charges and representation petitions, for managing the litigation of unfair labor practice cases, and for supervising the professional staff in their respective regions.

Ms. LeBold has been an attorney in the Chicago Regional Office of the FLRA since 1979, the first year of the FLRA's existence. She was a Supervisory Attorney from 1986 through 1988, and she has been a Regional Dispute Resolution Specialist since 2003. Ms. LeBold was also an Administrative Law Judge with the Illinois Human Rights Commission from May 1997 through April 2000. She earned a Bachelor of Arts from Indiana University, a Masters in American Studies from Purdue University, and received her J.D. from DePaul University College of Law.

Mr. Sullivan has been an attorney in the Denver Regional Office since 1987. He was a Dispute Resolution Specialist from 1995 through 1997, and he served as Regional Attorney in the Denver office from 1997 through 2003. He received his undergraduate degree from the University of Oklahoma and his J.D. from the University of Oklahoma College of Law.

The FLRA administers the labor-management relations program for 2.1 million non-Postal Federal employees worldwide. Approximately 1.2 million of these employees are represented in 2,200 bargaining units. The FLRA provides leadership by establishing policies and guidance related to Federal sector labor-management relations and by resolving disputes under, and ensuring compliance with, the Federal Service Labor-Management Relations Statute. The Office of General Counsel is the FLRA's independent investigative and prosecutorial component. The OGC's seven regional offices investigate, settle, and prosecute unfair labor practice charges, resolve representation disputes including the conduct of secret ballot elections, and provide training to Federal sector parties on improving their labor-management relations.
